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## British Values Statement

### Democracy

- We share in the celebrations of Diwali, Chinese new year, Yom Kippur, Christmas, Hanukkah, etc.
- At Chew Stoke Out Of School Club there is a strong focus on Christian Values which are displayed around the setting.
